2 Corinthians 14 and 15 reminds us that through us God "spreads everywhere the fragrance of the knowledge of him. For we are to God the aroma of Christ...."

Writing to the believers in Philippi to thank them for their support Paul says, "The gifts you sent...were more than enough, like a sweet-smelling sacrifice..., filling the air with fragrance, pleasing God no end." (Philippians 4:18).

On the other hand, in Amos 5:21, God says he hates and rejects burnt offerings made as a show of worship by those who, at the same time, are living unrighteous lives.

The sickening smell of insincere worship and self-serving living.

The fragrance of true worship, witness, and service.

Stay In Touch

How lovely are the messengers that bring us the gospel of peace! To all the nations is gone forth the sound of their words, throughout all the lands their glad tidings. (Romans 10:15,18)

As I write this Barbara is setting up a Yahoo equivalent of Skype account on her laptop. Barbara will then be able to talk to and look at her friend who has moved to the west coast, and friends across the globe for that matter.

It may be hard to remember or imagine now, but during the 1950s national telephone companies actually invested money in popularizing the use of telephones. The average for telephone use during the early 1950s was fewer than two calls a day! The house I lived in when I was a child had one telephone – it was in the front hall. Other houses had the telephone in the kitchen.

Seemingly, everywhere you look today, people have a phone fixation; talking, texting, watching movies, checking information, or listening to music. No church meeting is complete without people looking at their screens and losing track of the conversation. Some people are so addicted to their phones that they try “phone vacations,” locking their phones away except for emergency use. They’re trying to recapture some space for peace-and-quiet or for the face-to-face communication lost by the omnipresence of the cell phone. Interestingly, this appears to be more of a problem for middle-aged people; I see teens and young adults as having a better etiquette with their devices.

We human beings are instinctive communicators. We don’t communicate only through words, but through body language - picking up signals about how others are feeling and reacting towards us. This is why emails, efficient though they can be, and carefully though written, are poor substitutes for personal communication.

Communication has its contemporary challenges, but those challenges parallel timeless transcendent ones. Prayer is our attempt to communicate with God, and also God’s attempt to communicate with us. The translator of [The Message: The Bible in Contemporary Language](#), Eugene Peterson says, "God yearns to converse with you. And he wants far more than just 'thanks for this, can I please have that' prayer." An old Roman Catholic liturgical prayer (I recall it being one of the weekday prefaces) says: O God, you have no need of our praise, yet our desire to thank you is itself your gift. Our prayer of thanksgiving adds nothing to your greatness, but makes us grow in your grace.

Prayer isn’t something we do for God. It’s something God does for us, to remind us daily how much we are loved and given the gift of the grace we need. Prayer is not a text, a tweet, a call, or an app.; it is communion with the beginning and the end – with the meaning of creation.

Great Maker of us all, you created us for community, and our hearts were made to reach out to you and to one another. Help us each day to offer you our thoughts, words, and hearts, and to listen for the voice of your love. Amen.

There's Still Time 2015-2016 Preschool Registration

There's still time to register your child for the two quality, affordable preschool programs offered at Quakertown United Methodist Church for the 2015-16 school year. Openings remain in the Parent's Time Out program for 2's and Faith Preschool 2 day classes for 3-year-olds.

PARENT'S TIME OUT provides one-day-a-week programming for 2's (and young 3's). It is a semi-structured play experience, designed to give children a positive first start to being on their own, as well as to provide parents and caregivers some needed "time out." Each class includes free play, circle time, Bible story, music, crafts, snack, and gym. Additional enrichment activities include Lunch Bunch and mini-camp electives. Children may register throughout the year as they turn 2 and do not need to be potty trained.

FAITH PRESCHOOL offers AM and PM classes for 3's and 4's that provide a nurturing first-school experience, which emphasizes learning activities that are developmentally appropriate, while preparing students for a successful transition to kindergarten. Daily activities include free play, circle time, music, stories, pre-literacy skill development, math, art, snack, and gym. Openings for next school year are available in the 2-day classes for 3-year-olds, which meet on Tuesday and Thursday in the a.m. and p.m. Special enhancements to the 3-year-old program include music enrichment, Lunch Bunch, and mini-camp experiences.

A Recruitment Incentive equal to one month's tuition or its cash equivalent is being offered in select circumstances to those referring a new student to Parent's Time Out or Faith Preschool for September. Faith Preschool has concluded another successful year of providing high quality, affordable early childhood education to 67 three- and four-year-olds. End-of-year graduation and other celebrations saw Miller Hall packed with more than 200 parents, grandparents, and friends of the students.

The preschool's experienced staff will return in September for the school's fourteenth year: Beth Mininger, head teacher; Shana Reinford, teacher; Karen Godown, assistant teacher; Barb Hafler, office manager; and Melodie Schmouder, registrar and assistant teacher. The preschool's continuing success is attributable to the work of these dedicated individuals.

The preschool recognized Mrs. Godown's ten years of outstanding service.

Faith Preschool will have new leaders in September, as Janice and Jim Newcomer are moving from the area. The new chairpersons will be Melissa Tomlinson, Cristin Pizzi, and Susan Lennon. The board recognized the Newcomers' thirteen years of leadership.

Also leaving the board are Temple Sieger, parent representative; Jeff Stover, having also served ably for many years; and Jessica Albright. Board members in September will be Melissa Tomlinson, Cristin Pizzi, Susan Lennon, Chris Aber, Dr. Jenn Bubser, Jim Newcomer (transition), and parent representative Jen Reich. All Faith Preschool board members are required to be QUMC members with the exception of the parent rep.

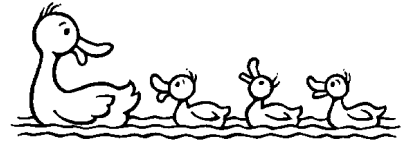
The preschool gave a \$2,500 gift to the church at year's end, including \$500 earmarked for the Trustees' use to care for God's house. The board also approved the purchase of several pieces of equipment for the church's playground.

In addition to the regular curriculum, Faith Preschool also offers Lunch Bunch, Summer Mini-Camp, Stretch 'n Grow wellness program, music, and special activities, such as Lehigh Valley Zoo.

The preschool and Parent's Time Out, the church's preschool program for two-year-olds, have begun discussions to incorporate PTO within the Faith Preschool structure. Cynthia Jamison will continue as the PTO director/teacher in September. Melodie Schmouder, co-founder and teacher, is stepping down after 14 years of dedicated service.

Many of you may view us as that pesky Stewardship Commission that bugs you every year to fill out a pledge card. Well, yes, we do do that; but we are charged to do much more. We are developing a 3-year plan to invite and encourage all of us to begin living more generous lives, reflecting our growing faith and trust in our generous God. We want to inspire all of us to love more, give more, serve more and pray more. We accept the challenge for ourselves and for you to look beyond our own needs and wants and to be willing to make sacrifices that will produce spiritual fruit and bring about life change. We want you to view, with us, our giving not as paying out but as buying in to what God is seeking to accomplish through this church.

How will we accomplish this? Through much prayer, study and growing together. Our 3-year plan includes the following:

- The clergy and lay leaders of the church modeling Christian stewardship through tithing (which means 10%) or taking steps toward this goal.
- Sermons several times a year to promote a better understanding of stewardship.
- Collection and study of our congregation's attitudes about, and patterns of, giving, reporting the results of such a study.
- Offering at least two adult education courses a year on stewardship, seeking to discern God's will regarding the giving of our time, talents and treasure.
- Developing a prayer ministry to help us in the development of attitudes of generosity.
