Can Something New Be Old? Old New?

And no one puts new wine into old wineskins. If you do, the wine will burst the skins - and the wine is destroyed, and so are the skins. But new wine is for fresh wineskins. Mark 2:22

“That's ancient, dude! You are so old school!” I'm old enough now to want to go somewhere new with this familiar passage from Mark about innovation. Sometimes I get to wondering if there is anything spiritually new out there. Is there anything new under the sun?

A Cambridge lecturer once gave a talk in Beijing. He began his lecture and, after a sentence or two, stopped in order to let the translator translate. But the translator waved him on saying, "Carry on; I'll tell you when to stop." So he carried on, uninterrupted, for about 15 minutes. The Chinese interpreter then turned to the audience and said four words in Mandarin. Four words, and then told the lecturer, "Carry on. Carry on."

The same thing happened after another 15 minutes. He spoke again and translator said four words. The same thing happened after 45 minutes and, at the end, the translator gives three words in Mandarin. As the audience left, he turned to the interpreter and said, "That was unbelievable! I gave a most complicated lecture and you compressed it into those few words. What did you say?"

The translator said, "That was easy. After 15 minutes I said, 'So far he hasn't said anything new.' After 30 minutes I said, 'He still hasn't said anything new.' After 45 minutes I said, 'I don't think he's going to say anything new,' and after an hour I said, 'I was right.'"

So can we say anything new about faith?

We are about to celebrate Rally Day (Sunday, September 13th) and launch into a whole new program year at Quakertown United Methodist Church. As the sun sets on our Rally Day, Jews will be celebrating Rosh Hashanah; new year. What little Hebrew I remember is rusty to be sure, but just last month I was reminded that לְשׁוֹנוֹת (Leshanot), the verb from which *shanah* comes, means “to repeat;” to do something a second time exactly as you did before. But *leshanot* also means “to revise or to change,” to do something a second time differently from the way you did it before. Two words, that are contrary in English – “repetition” and “change” – in Hebrew are represented by the same word. In other words, every time we repeat our experience we find in it something new.

That's what I'm hoping will happen for us this program year, beginning with our September 13th Rally Day; I hope, as we tell the old stories and repeat the patterns of years past, we'll be filled with new inspiration and remember again the hope that God renews in us always and ever.

God of every new beginning, help us remember that what is new is old and what is old is also new. Amen.

Sunday School Classes

All classes are open to everyone.

Newborns and children through 5th grade will use the David C. Cook Bible-in-Life curriculum. This series is Bible based, teaching scripture knowledge with God-honoring Biblical values. The fall themes for this year include “God gives us families, friends, and church” and “The God who created us, corrects us, and calls us.”

Middle School Students will use the rfour.org Season 2 curriculum, which creates direct links for students between Old and New Testament faith stories with application to daily living. This fall features sessions entitled Language, God and Conflict, Birth Stories, and God & Our Attention.

High School Students will learn of God through Bible studies, scripture knowledge, and devotionals with ties to current events and hot topics. They will gain practice applying their learning to real world situations. The David C. Cook curriculum provides teens with experiences designed to help them make a successful transition into owning their faith.

Women’s Class, led by Mary Schwer in Room 114, uses material developed by the “International Sunday School Lessons for Christian Teaching.” The Bible based lessons are applied to daily living as Christ’s followers in our homes, work places, churches, community, and the wider world. The theme for the fall quarter is “The Christian Community Comes Alive.”

Men’s Class meets in Room 112. They will shortly complete their current studies based on the Men of Integrity materials, and begin using the Our Daily Bread devotional. Their focus is on learning how to draw on God’s power to guide them in the challenges of daily life through Bible study, reflection, and prayer.

FaithBuilders: This class, led by Gail Schadler, meets in Room 109 to explore elective studies throughout the year. Beginning on September 20, the focus will be on “Fruit of the Spirit.” What is it? What should the fruit of the Spirit look like in your life? How can you cultivate and then protect the fruit? Jesus is looking for the fruit of the Spirit in our lives. If you really are a Christian, where’s your fruit? This class will be the first of many this Sunday School year that will look at how we can grow in Christ and how to live and walk in the Spirit so that we can inherit the Kingdom of God. “Fruit of the Spirit” will be followed by a series of classes on Spiritual Disciplines and Spiritual Gifts, and later by a study on the parable of the Prodigal Son.

Sunday Morning Life Group: This life group meets during the Sunday School hour in the parlor, focusing on family - specifically raising children in this modern world. Adults attending have children of all ages, from infants and teens to adult children, and help and support each other as they take on the wonderful, yet challenging, journey called parenthood. It also explores building marriages that will go the distance. This group is open to everyone that wishes to join the discussion.



From Extravagant Generosity



“Give and it will be given to you.” The members of the Extravagant Generosity Team have agreed to spend at least three years promoting an intentional effort to grow the understanding of, and commitment to, biblical principles of stewardship in our congregation. Our three-year plan includes:

- Communicating frequently and regularly with the congregation about giving by means of sermons, newsletter articles, bulletin and website articles, letters, testimonies
- Offering Adult and Children’s education classes each year on the subject of stewardship
- Commissioning a Prayer Ministry to pray regularly for the development of an attitude of generosity among members
- Offering regular Bible studies, seeking God’s message on giving
- Collecting and studying patterns of giving of the congregation
- Developing a challenging year-round stewardship message to enhance the six-week pledge drive

Based upon the results of the May 31 congregational survey, the Extravagant Generosity Team has determined that the following actions be included in the three-year plan:

- Defining “percentage” giving and developing practical ways of achieving an increase in this type of giving
- Reporting on the ways that giving is connected with ministries of the church. Example: previewing mission trips and upcoming opportunities; making video presentations; celebrating the impact of ministries, especially local.
- Regular reporting of the financial status of our church and the results of special offerings
- Communicating expectations of giving with new members at New Member classes
- Placing more emphasis on Care of God’s House, such as reporting on improvements both made and needing to be made to the church property, and including Care of God’s House giving on the step chart on the back of the pledge card.
- Promoting electronic giving

When we are truly grateful to God for His extravagant generosity, giving becomes a joy, not a burden.

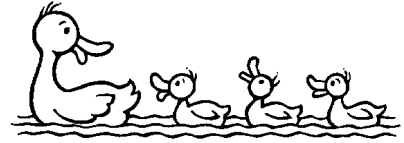
