It's Time



*“Get rid of all bitterness...and anger...Be kind and compassionate to one another,
forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.”*

Ephesians 4:31,32

In the third chapter of Ecclesiastes the writer refers to the ebb and flow of life. He cites (v.3) “a time to heal...a time to build up,” (and v.7) “a time to mend.”

Our church has been experiencing some difficult times - times that call for healing, building up, and mending. To that end there will be a Festival Service of worship on Sunday, April 24, at 10:00. Consultant the Reverend Dr. Bud Holland will preach and lead us in a time of healing.

Jesus prayed for his followers to “be one.” Does this mean we must all think alike? Of course not. That would be boring, not to mention impossible. But it calls for us, as followers of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, to be one in focus. Our church is not just one of many organizations that provide fellowship and do good deeds. Our purpose is - in all we say and do - to glorify God and to witness to the good news of the gospel to a fractured world full of hate and strife. How can we carry out our calling if we ourselves are fractured?

A few years ago our congregation developed and adopted a covenant. It was aimed at reminding us of how Christ’s followers should interact, even when - or maybe especially when - in disagreement. We must listen respectfully to other’s points of view. We are reminded to display the fruit of the spirit: “love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control” (Galatians 5:22,23).

One of the editor’s college professors often put it this way: “Let us agree to disagree agreeably.” It’s time.

"There are other worlds to sing in"

His name was Paul. He lived in a small town in the Pacific Northwest some years ago. He was just a little boy when his family became the proud owners of one of the first telephones in the neighborhood. It was one of those wooden boxes attached to the wall with the shiny receiver hanging on the side of the box...and the mouthpiece attached to the front. Young Paul listened with fascination as his mom and dad used the phone...and he discovered that somewhere inside the wonderful device called a telephone lived an amazing person.

Her name was "Information Please"...and there was nothing she did not know. "Information Please" could supply anybody's number...and the correct time! Paul's first personal experience with "Information Please" came one day when he was home alone and he whacked his finger with a hammer. The pain was terrible and he didn't know what to do...and then he thought of the telephone. Quickly, he pulled a footstool up to the phone, climbed up, unhooked the receiver, held it to his ear and said, "Information Please..." There was a click or two and then a small clear voice spoke, "Information." "I hurt my finger," Paul wailed into the phone. "Isn't your mother home?" "Nobody's home but me," Paul cried. "Are you bleeding?" "No," Paul said. "I hit my finger with the hammer and it hurts." "Can you open your ice-box?" "Yes." "Then go get some ice and hold it to your finger." Paul did and it helped a lot.

After that Paul called "Information Please" for everything. She helped him with his geography and his math. She taught him how to spell the word "fix." She told him what to feed his pet chipmunk. And then when Paul's pet canary died, she listened to his grief tenderly and then said, "Paul, always remember that there are other worlds to sing in." Somehow that helped and Paul felt better.

When Paul was nine years old, he moved with his family to Boston...and as the years passed he missed "Information Please" very much. Some years later Paul was on his way out west to go to college. When he arrived in Seattle, he dialed his hometown operator and said, "Information Please."

Miraculously, he heard that same small clear voice that he knew so well. "Information." Paul hadn't planned this, but suddenly he blurted out, "Could you please tell me how to spell the word 'fix'?" There was a long pause. Then came the soft answer, "I guess your finger must be all healed by now." Paul laughed. "So it's really still you. Do you have any idea how much you meant to me during that time when I was a little boy?" "I wonder," she said, "if you know how much your calls meant to me! I never had any children and I used to look forward to your calls so much."

Paul told her how much he had missed her over the years and asked her if he could call her again when he was back in the area. "Please do," she said. "Just ask for Sally." Three months later Paul was back in Seattle. This time a different voice answered. He asked for Sally. "Are you a friend?" the operator asked. "Yes, a very old friend." Paul answered. "Well, I'm sorry to have to tell you this," she said. "Sally had been working part time the last few years because she was sick. She died five weeks ago." Before he could hang up the operator said, "Wait a minute. Is your name Paul?"



“Yes.” “Well, Sally left a message for you. She wrote it down in case you called. Let me read it to you. It says, ‘When Paul calls, tell him that I still say, *There are other worlds to sing in.*’ He will know what I mean.” Paul thanked her and hung up...he did know what Sally meant.

“There are other worlds to sing in.” Isn’t that a beautiful and powerful thought? The Easter story tells us that in this life, and through eternity, we belong to God. When Jesus paid the price for our sin with his life he made it possible for us to know our loving heavenly Father.

Are you searching? Struggling? Doubting? You can find meaning...make a new start...become a new person. By God’s grace, there are other worlds to sing in!

We hope most of you know that QUMC has an outstanding preschool program, which makes good use of our building. This coming school year, 2016-2017, the previous Parent's Time Out and Faith Preschool will merge and serve 2-, 3- and 4-year olds of our community.

PTO began in 2001 and FPS opened its doors in 2002 with the full support of the administrative board, which realized this would be a wonderful outreach and mission to our congregation and community. That has definitely proven to be the case with full enrollment for FPS of 70 students each year. If you do the math you find that more than 900 children and their families have received a quality Christian preschool experience. Add to that the 500 or so PTO students! Surely, this is cause to celebrate!

Over the years many of these children have participated in special activities at our church, including such things as Vacation Bible School and the annual Easter egg hunt. Several families have joined or regularly attend QUMC as a direct result of this program. Many, including the Quakertown Community School District and the Bucks County IU, have praised the preparedness of these children for the challenges of elementary school. At the same time they have heard the good news of Jesus Christ.

FPS and PTO have always been self-sustaining ministries of QUMC, reimbursing the church for custodial, telephone, and copying machine expenses. Through the years they have also contributed gifts and other contributions to the church totaling more than \$20,000. We all need to support this important mission of our church, extending a helping hand and offering words of appreciation to the dedicated members of the staff of FPS for the valuable work they do.




Make a Splash!




