Anyone who has been paying even the least bit of attention to what is going on would agree that labeling fosters divisiveness. And divisiveness is crippling.

The antidote: looking at every person as one for whom Jesus died. That understanding rips off the labels and has the power to turn foes into friends.

Labels belong on soup cans, not people.

"Why do you go to church?"

Has anyone ever asked you this question: "Why do you go to church?" If so, how did you answer it? How would you answer it today?

Some might answer it by saying "I go to worship God." Others may say they go to get spiritually fed to help them maneuver through the coming week. Some may just mention they go to church to be part of a community of friends who believe as they do. All of these are good answers.

Why did Jesus go to synagogue every Sabbath? Let's look at a couple of examples of Jesus at the house of God.

- While in the synagogue one Sabbath, a man with a withered hand is also there. Jesus sees him and calls him up and heals him (see Matthew 12).
- Another time he is accosted by a man with an unclean spirit. Jesus calms the man and heals him (see Mark 1).
- Still another time Jesus sees a woman crippled over with what may be arthritis. He heals her (see Luke 13)
- "Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people." (Matthew 4:23)

Jesus went into the synagogues to share the good news of God's kingdom, to heal the sick, and restore the broken. And when Jesus left the synagogue, he continued to do the same thing on the roads, in the homes, and out in the country.

So, here's my thought about going to church that I want you to consider –

WHAT IF we took our going to church as seriously as Jesus took going to the synagogue?

WHAT IF we went to church like Jesus looking to see who God would introduce him to for a healing message?

WHAT IF we went each week with an **EXPECTATION** in our spirit that God would have us encounter one person specifically that day to show them God's loving grace?

- Jesus is walking along the shore, sees two brothers- Simon & Andrew. Jesus invites them to follow him. (Matt. 4:15)
- Jesus enters Capernaum when he encounters a Roman centurion asking for healing for his servant. (Matt 8:5)
- Jesus enters Peter's home where Peter's mother-in-law is very sick. Jesus heals her. (Matt 8:14)
- Jesus is walking in the country when two men come at him possessed by demons. He heals them. (Matt 8:28)

Do you see the picture that the Gospels paint of Jesus? Wherever he goes, he encounters people in need of God's touch. Jesus provides a living encounter with God for these people.



That's what God has called us to do. So, this Sunday, come to church expecting God to give you an encounter in which YOU get to be God's living presence for someone in need.




Didn't Sign Up for Preschool?


