One of the most prominent and beautiful images in scripture is Jacob's Ladder. In the story, Jacob stops to rest on his way from Beersheba to Harran (Genesis 28:10-17).

Jacob puts a stone under his head for a pillow and lays down to sleep. But he is startled by a dream in which he sees a beautiful ladder (or stairway) reaching earth to heaven upon which angels ascend and descend. The Lord God above it blesses Jacob and declares that God will be with him everywhere he goes.

When Jacob awakens, he declares breathless: "Surely the LORD is in this place, and I was not aware of it!"

In our lives today, we go about our week intent on getting things done, getting from one place to another, observing the world around us, focused on the next thing. Often, we forget to stop in between and feel the presence of Jesus around us, among us, and within us, blessing us and renewing us.

The metaphor of the ladder is so very beautiful, for it is a sign of God's intervention in our lives -- God's promise, presence, and saving power.

In our world, we most often think of the ladder as something a firefighter brings to the scene of a tragedy or difficult situation. When fire strikes, when a cat gets stuck in the top branches of a tree, when we find ourselves stuck on a cliff or roof or in a flooding car —the firefighters are the ones who come to the rescue. All we need to see is that ladder extending toward us, and we know, we will live, because someone cared enough to rescue us from our plight, someone not afraid to intervene in the midst of the most difficult circumstances.

Jesus is that intervention for us on an even larger and deeper level. Jesus is our savior, our rescuer, our lifegiver.

Nathaniel saw who Jesus was before anyone else:

Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!" Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these." And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man." (John 1:47-51)

Jesus IS the ladder, God's grand and beautiful intervention into our lives and our world, come to rescue us from ourselves and restore us to health, life, and hope.

Whenever you feel down, whenever life seems to have trapped you, and you feel stuck and sorrowful, whenever you feel those walls of contention closing in, stop for a moment. Take a breath. Close your eyes. Feel the presence and the power of Jesus. For He is with you everywhere you go.

Saturday, October 27, 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon



#### **QUMC Educational Endowment Fund Grants**

Joyfully, we will be distributing grants to eligible students on November 25, 2018.

To be eligible, students must be members in good standing of QUMC and must be enrolled and attending <u>this</u> academic year in an institution of higher education (including technical schools).

Students must request an application by phone, mail, email, or in person beginning October 1. Requests must be made directly to Steve Finch, Endowment Chair (finchsc1@verizon.net or 215.538.0835). Applications must be completed by the applicant and returned to Steve by email or printed and mailed by midnight on November 1. The committee prefers that applications be sent from a college email address in MS Word or PDF format.

After review, students will receive an email confirmation that they have met the eligibility requirements to receive a grant. Grants will be distributed during worship services on United Methodist Sunday, November 25, 2018.

There are no financial aid requirements. The grant formula is **available funds/number of eligible students=grant per student.** See Steve Finch or a committee member with questions. Committee members include John DeSimone, Julie James, Brad Mushrush, Nancy Parry, and David Rush.
