Children's Message for December: My Favorite Nativity Animals



Hi Kids,

Before you realize it, it will be Christmas Day. Years ago, my father-in-law made our family a large wooden nativity set for Christmas. He filled it with figures of Mary and Joseph and the baby Jesus and with all kinds of animal figures he bought at Sine's 5 & 10 store. When I pulled out the Nativity set this year, I thought about the "nativity" animals I liked the best. There are plenty of animals to choose from – goats and donkeys and camels and elephants and cows and sheep and chickens and pigs and so on. I chose three of my favorite "nativity" animals to write to you about, but you probably have your own favorites.

- I really like the donkey because this good friend of man's, no matter what many people think, is actually very intelligent and hardworking, very dependable and friendly. It was a simple donkey that faithfully carried Mary and Joseph and their belongings almost 100 miles from Nazareth to the city of Bethlehem, where Jesus was born.
- I also like the camel, which we don't often think of as part of the nativity story. Camels are tough animals, and they were especially important for travel in Jesus' time, because they could store a supply of water and food in humps on their backs for making long trips. Wise men who traveled across the desert to visit the newborn King, Jesus, probably rode on camels.
- My third choice is the lamb. I think of a lamb as soft, gentle, and innocent, much like a newborn baby much like the baby, Jesus. A lamb grows up to be a sheep at age one, and becomes shaggy and rugged in order to survive extreme weather. When Baby Jesus grew up to become a man, he, too, had to prepare for tough times.

Think about all the different animals that were lucky enough to be at Jesus' birth. Choose a couple of <u>your</u> favorite "nativity" animals, and maybe your parents can help you discover some new and interesting facts about them.

COVID~19 Update

Check your email or USPS mail to keep updated about COVID-19 updates in regard to the church.

As of November 20, there is no indoor in-person worship at QUMC until positivity rates drop to below 10%. Positivity rates are rising at an alarming rate. For the week ending December 4, the positivity rate in Bucks County was an alarming 15.3%. Please continue to wear your mask, wash your hands, and practice social distancing to keep not only yourself, but others, safe.

Based on this data, Church Council passed a scale of sanctuary occupancy numbers within the limits of the Bishop's guidelines but according to what is in the best interest of safety standards for QUMC:

- 0-8 % positivity rate: 50-60 (total) allowable in the sanctuary
- 8.1-9.9% positivity rate: 25 (total) allowable in the sanctuary
- 10% positivity rate: virtual worship only (no indoor in-person worship)

You may attend the 9 AM Parking Lot Service as this service is safe and will continue. You may also watch worship online on our Facebook page, Sunday mornings at 11 AM during the Livestream (or any time during the week).

The church is now closed for all in-person activity. No one is to enter the church without permission. The Church Secretary will continue her daily check-in for mail and will continue to utilize the copier in the church office. Otherwise, she will be working remotely from home. The Financial Secretaries will continue to count weekly offerings, the Pastor will occasionally stop in, and the Sexton will continue to clean the building. Other than that, no staff or parishioners are to be in the church building.

If you opt to meet outdoors, masks must still be worn.

All meetings and groups must meet online. If you need a ZOOM link for such purposes, contact the Church Secretary (barb@qumc.com or 215.538.7817).

Updated Status of the Budget Development for 2021: The Finance Committee is working on a proposed 2021 QUMC Budget to take to the Church Council for its consideration and approval. This is a very important time for the many leaders in our church as difficult decisions will need to be made in order to prepare the proposed budget for the Church Council. Continued Appeal Regarding Bequest Opportunities: Bequests from individuals are an important part of the funding of our church's missions. If or when you plan a charitable bequest to help support the mission of the Quakertown United Methodist Church, you can direct your bequest it the following ways:

- 1. Unrestricted bequest: This is a gift for our general purposes, to be used at the discretion of our Trustees and Finance Committees. A gift like this without conditions attached is frequently the most useful, as it allows us to determine the wisest and most pressing need for the funds at the time of receipt.
- 2. Restricted bequest: This type of gift allows you to specify how the funds are to be used. Perhaps you have a special purpose or project in mind. If so, it's best to consult us when you make your will to be certain that your intent can be carried out.
- 3. Honorary or Memorial bequest: This is a gift given "in honor of" or "in memory of" someone. We are pleased to honor your request and have many ways to grant appropriate recognition.
- 4. Endowed bequest: This bequest allows you to restrict the principal of your gift, requiring us to hold the funds permanently and use only the investment income they generate. Creating an endowment in manner means that your gift can continue giving indefinitely.


Holy Communion: Sunday, January 10, 2020
