Verses to Help You Rest this Summer

Hammock? Check.
Lemonade? Check.
A good book? Check.
An afternoon all to yourself? Check.



Mix those four ingredients together and you have a recipe for a perfect summer afternoon. So why can't you relax? Why is your mind racing a mile a minute, as usual? What seems to be missing? There is one more secret ingredient needed for this dish and it is often overlooked - a spirit at peace.

For many of us, pushing the pause button is easier said than done, even during the summer months when life should slow down a little, giving us a chance to catch our breath and relax. But just as physical rest is necessary for a healthy body, spiritual rest is important for our spiritual well-being. And the best way to rest your spirit is to rest in the One who created you.

The notion of resting is a theme woven throughout Scripture beginning ... well, at the very beginning.

"On the seventh day God had finished His work of creation, so He rested from all His work."

Genesis 2:2 NLT

Even God took a day to rest after creating the world and it's a lesson He intends for us to follow. Here are six verses you can focus on this summer – verses to remind you to rest in God and lean into Him so you can relax and fully enjoy the season.

"The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need. He lets me rest in green meadows; he leads me beside peaceful streams. He renews my strength."

Psalms 23: 1-2 NLT

In God, we have all that we need. No matter what. He knows the "green meadows" and "peaceful streams" that will restore and renew each of us. And He promises to deliver. When we walk with Him, we can count on Him for complete rest and restoration.

"It is useless for you to work so hard from early morning until late at night, anxiously working for food to eat: for God gives rest to His loved ones."

Psalm 127: 2 NLT

Even with the best of intentions, we can easily slip back into the habit of counting on ourselves to meet our needs. We honor God with our work but not when it serves as a cover for our inability to trust in Him. Trusting in Him, while working and resting, is the key to renewal and refreshment.

"Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life ... your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you."

Matthew 6: 25-34 NKJV

In this passage, Jesus makes it clear that worrying about the future is a waste of time. Instead, He reminds us that our heavenly Father values us above all else and He will care for us just as He does the flowers of the fields and the birds of the air.

"Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

Matthew 11: 28-29 NIV

Responsibilities can be overwhelming but Jesus promises to help carry the load. And His shoulders are much bigger than ours! While He doesn't promise a life without hard work and trials, He does promise to be our partner, participating with us and walking with us every step of the way.

"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Phil. 4: 6-7 NASB

In this passage, Paul provides some great advice – he suggests we turn our worries into prayers. When we stop worrying and start praying we will be filled with the complete peace and rest that only God can provide.


"I have told you these things so that, in Me, you may have peace. In this world, you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

Summer Children's Message: Star Bright



Hi Kids!

We recently celebrated the Fourth of July in America! You probably saw star symbols all over, including on posters, banners, picnic plates, and clothing. You also saw our country's flag displayed in many places. Our country's flag has 50 white stars on a blue background and 13 red and white stripes on it. Each one of the 50 stars stands for a different state, and all together they make up the United States of America. You live in the state of Pennsylvania, but you may have been to another state at some time, if you visited a far-away relative or took a vacation somewhere like the seashore, Disney World, or a national park. Our 50 states are separated by lines on a map, but they all work together to keep our country strong and help each other in times of disasters, such as floods and fires.

Now, when we think about stars from our Bible stories, we think first about the Nativity star which shone brightly above the stable on the night baby Jesus was born and which led the shepherds to his birthplace. We often see the symbol of the Nativity star at Christmas time on cards and ornaments and tree tops and wreaths. Real stars, of course, are not 5-pointed yellow shapes, but are balls of gas and dust held together by gravity, floating in space millions of miles away. Billions of stars travel down to our galaxy over time and light up the sky. On a clear night, there are so many bright stars, that it looks like someone sprinkled glitter throughout the heavens. Stars are all different sizes and shapes and colors. Some stars look like they are twinkling. Some stars are in groups and look like dot-to-dot animal drawings. Many people like to study the stars; some even name stars after loved ones. Get a chair and sit outside on a clear summer night and look up at the stars. Be amazed. All of God's creations are awesome, but stars are especially neat. God is very proud of his stars. Psalms 147:4 in the Bible says that God counts all the stars in the sky and calls them by name, much the same way God knows and loves each and every one of us. There are billions of people on Earth, like there are stars – we all look and act differently, and each one has his or her own light to shine. Let your light shine bright, and make God proud of you.

QUMC COVID PROTOCOL: APPROVED JULY 1, 2021

- Our church will return to 100% capacity in the sanctuary and in all rooms in the church building.
- Fully vaccinated persons will no longer be required to wear masks indoors or outdoors. We encourage unvaccinated persons, however, to mask and maintain social distancing per CDC guidelines. Parents are encouraged to make a decision for their child(ren) as they engage in ministry.
- All persons in the sanctuary, whether masked or unmasked, may now sing and responsively pray and recite aloud.
- All hymnals and bibles will be returned to the pews unbanded.
- Social distancing will not be required for fully vaccinated persons.
- Service offerings will continue to be collected in baskets at the back of the sanctuary until we have enough ushers to begin collecting by passing the offering plates.
- Communion will be offered the first Sunday of each month. We will continue to use the prepackaged packets until we have a communion team to prepare the traditional juice and bread cubes and communion plates, and have ushers to distribute them.
- Fully vaccinated persons may remain unmasked in the kitchen. We encourage unvaccinated persons to wear a mask and social distance while in the kitchen. Those who would like to volunteer to work in the kitchen should be aware that those people who are in the kitchen may not all be vaccinated.
- Outside groups will now be allowed to use our facility. Each group must complete the Use of Building form for approval by Trustees as coordinated by the Church Office. We encourage those who are unvaccinated to wear masks and social distance.
- Masks and hand sanitizer will now be offered at the Welcome Table.



A Word from the Board of Trustees

Hopefully you have noticed the new landscaping that has been completed at the church. The Trustees voted to have a professional landscaper render an opinion as to what could be done to our landscaping to improve the curb appeal of our church building.

The previous bushes were the original ones from construction of our building and were, therefore, over 30 years old. As they were so overgrown, it has no longer been possible for them to be kept trimmed back from the building without leaving large dead, unsightly bare spots that would never fill in properly. In addition to that, mold was becoming a problem on the brick façade of our beautiful building.

The landscaper chose plantings that would add color at different times to our beds. Some of the ones chosen were burning bushes, drift roses, viburnum, rhododendrons, spirea and tri-color willows. He suggested leaving the large arborvitae at the corners since they are beautiful, require little maintenance and aren't causing any problems to the building.

The Prayer Garden also received needed attention while the landscaper was here as well.

It is the responsibility of the Trustees to do all that they can to take care of our building and grounds and they agreed that this was an important step in fulfilling their mission. We know that you do too!

A gift like this without conditions attached is frequently the most useful, as it allows us to determine the wisest and most pressing need for the funds at the time of receipt.
- 2. Restricted bequest: This type of gift allows you to specify how the funds are to be used. Perhaps you have a special purpose or project in mind. If so, it's best to consult us when you make your will to be certain that your intent can be carried out.
- 3. Honorary or Memorial bequest: This is a gift given "in honor of" or "in memory of" someone. We are pleased to honor your request and have many ways to grant appropriate recognition.
- 4. Endowed bequest: This bequest allows you to restrict the principal of your gift, requiring us to hold the funds permanently and use only the investment income they generate. Creating an endowment in manner means that your gift can continue giving indefinitely.

The Harold C. Weamer Charitable Trust

Between July 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021, a total of \$24,000 was remitted to Quakertown United Methodist Church per the stipulations of the Harold C. Weamer Charitable Trust. Bag and bring your cans to the two white trash cans at the church pavilion. They do not need to be crushed but they are easier to handle if they are. All brands of aluminum cans are welcome. Proceeds from can recycling helps to defray costs of the annual Chicken Barbeque.
