Children's Sunday School

<u>2-Years-Old to Kindergarten</u> will use the Heart Shaper resource to begin their journey of faith. This will help build a relationship with God through fun, multi-sensory learning through Bible stories, activities, and songs.

<u>Grades 1 to 5</u> will use the Celebrate Wonder curriculum by Cokesbury Kids, giving children the tools to explore their faith while incorporating it into their daily lives. This curriculum uses carefully selected Bible stories, songs, videos, and hands-on activities.

<u>Middle and High School (Grades 6 to 12)</u> will use The Gospel Project, a weekly Bible study that helps teens dive deep into the big story of the Bible - God's plan to rescue his people through his son, Jesus Christ. This program encourages students to ask tough questions and expect real answers. Dialogue each week between the students is rich and meaningful. Students come out of the class with thought-provoking questions to ask their families at home.

Adult Sunday School

The Faithbuilders Class, led by Gail Schadler, offers a new adult elective study, The Sermon on the Mount, "the greatest sermon ever given by the greatest man who ever lived!" From the Beatitudes to the Lord's Prayer, to the Golden Rule, we will take an in-depth look at Matthew 5-7 to discuss the doctrines and principles of righteousness that Jesus taught would lead believers to happiness, eventual perfection, and eternal life. This is the longest explanation Jesus gives of what it looks like to live as His follower and to serve as a member of God's Kingdom.

The Women's Class, led_by Laura Lillie, follows the Cokesbury Adult Bible Study series. Each quarter (fall, winter, spring, summer) contains 13 lessons exploring Biblical messages and how to apply them to daily life by focusing on personal, family, church, and community concerns. This fall, the class will look into ways to respond to God's gracious salvation. From September 5 through November 28, the theme of "Belong" will explore the spiritual practices of hospitality, community, and open table fellowship. Beginning on December 5, the class will discuss waiting, wondering, and show-and-tell under the theme of "Engage."


<u>The Men's Class</u>, under the direction of Ken McKinley, will delve into "Our Daily Bread" devotionals and related scripture and Bible study. Through this study, men will grow in their relationship with God and with each other, while discussing ways to apply scripture to daily life. Beginning on Rally Day, the class will be open to suggestions from class members on future studies.

Small Groups

<u>Bread for the Journey</u> (start date to be announced) meets Tuesdays at 1:00 p.m. in the Library. Together we pray, explore Scripture, and read and discuss books as we journey together to grow in our relationship with God. <u>Friday Online Bible Study</u> (starting September 17) meets on Friday mornings at 9:30 a.m. on ZOOM. Our first study, The Life of Moses, will take an in-depth look at the man who was called by God to be the agent in delivering the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt. As mediator of the Covenant, Moses found the nation of Israel and laid down the spiritual foundation of Judaism, from which arose Christianity. This study will be followed with a look at The Trinity, followed by ending 2021 with an advent study, The Marys of the New Testament. NEW SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP SCHEDULE



Our new worship and Sunday School schedule at QUMC, as of Sunday, September 5, will be:

- 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. Worship
- 9:45 to 10:45 a.m. Sunday School for Children and Adults (starting Sunday, September 12)
- 11:00 a.m. to 12 noon Worship

11:00 a.m. worship will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook and YouTube.

We feel that this schedule allows for more fellowship between worshippers and less stress for the Pastor, musicians, and Sunday School teachers. Our hope is that the 30-minute change for 8:00 and 9:00 a.m. attendees will not be a problem.

This change in schedule was after prayerful and careful analysis of our worship services. Pastor Rick and the Worship Team put forth a change in the worship schedule, allowing for a less rushed schedule of services and Sunday School (which starts Rally Day, September 12). This proposed schedule does not have a Contemporary Service timeslot. The reality at QUMC, at this time, is that we do not have enough musicians who are willing, or can, commit to carrying a contemporary service each and every Sunday. Bethan Neely and Jerry Elder are actively collaborating with, and seeking, musicians. We feel it would be unwise to require individuals to commit to a worship service each Sunday at this present juncture. This is exactly what caused the burn-out and failure of our past contemporary service. As we build up the band, musicians will be invited to play and sing at either of our worship services as their schedules allow.

Parking lot worshippers are encouraged to attend either of the worship services in the sanctuary or watch the livestream if they are uncomfortable worshipping indoors. All worshippers are permitted to wear masks, regardless of vaccination status.

QUMC COVID PROTOCOL: APPROVED JULY 1, 2021

- Our church will return to 100% capacity in the sanctuary and in all rooms in the church building.
- Fully vaccinated persons will no longer be required to wear masks indoors or outdoors. We encourage unvaccinated persons, however, to mask and maintain social distancing per CDC guidelines. Parents are encouraged to make a decision for their child(ren) as they engage in ministry.
- All persons in the sanctuary, whether masked or unmasked, may now sing and responsively pray and recite aloud.
- All hymnals and bibles will be returned to the pews unbanded.
- Social distancing will not be required for fully vaccinated persons.
- Service offerings will continue to be collected in baskets at the back of the sanctuary until we have enough ushers to begin collecting by passing the offering plates.
- Communion will be offered the first Sunday of each month. We will continue to use the prepackaged packets until we have a communion team to prepare the traditional juice and bread cubes and communion plates, and have ushers to distribute them.
- Fully vaccinated persons may remain unmasked in the kitchen. We encourage unvaccinated persons to wear a mask and social distance while in the kitchen. Those who would like to volunteer to work in the kitchen should be aware that those people who are in the kitchen may not all be vaccinated.
- Outside groups will now be allowed to use our facility. Each group must complete the Use of Building form for approval by Trustees as coordinated by the Church Office. We encourage those who are unvaccinated to wear masks and social distance.
- Masks and hand sanitizer will now be offered at the Welcome Table.

I have attached below what the Conference sent me in regards to the Youth Rally cancellation:

Eastern PA Conference youth ministry leaders are forced to cancel the August 28 Youth Rally at Covenant UMC in Bath Township due to an increasing risk of COVID-19 infection in Northampton County - particularly the virus's delta variant - especially among unvaccinated youth. The Rev. William Brawner, Conference Coordinator of Youth & Young Adult Ministries, announced the cancellation this week.

"It hurts to cancel this rally that so many youth have been looking forward to; but we can't take the risk," said Brawner. "Some parents have expressed concerns. And even though most of it would be outdoors, the youth would still have to wear masks all during the rally."

"This was a very tough call, but it is the right one," said Michael Gold, Covenant UMC's youth minister. The church hosted its first conference-wide youth rally, Camping at the Crossroads, in 2019. But the pandemic has now forced its cancellation for two years in a row. "We will replace this event with something much smaller for the community," said Gold. "We're working on offering a backpack giveaway drive that day, along with some music and food for up to two hours."

- 3. Honorary or Memorial bequest: This is a gift given "in honor of" or "in memory of" someone. We are pleased to honor your request and have many ways to grant appropriate recognition.
- 4. Endowed bequest: This bequest allows you to restrict the principal of your gift, requiring us to hold the funds permanently and use only the investment income they generate. Creating an endowment in manner means that your gift can continue giving indefinitely.
