It Takes A Team

Sports fans have a lot to cheer about in October. Baseball reaches a high point with post-season play; football is in full swing; hockey is gearing up.

Every sport has its stars. Baseball fans love the homerun hitters; all eyes are on football quarterbacks; basketball's slam-dunkers elicit the roars of the crowd. But in team sports, there can be no stars without teammates.

Baseball is noted for having statistics about everything. One of the categories is "most runs scored." No player can make the top of this list without his or her teammates. Somebody lays down the sacrifice bunt that moves the other players into scoring position, or hits the sacrifice fly or single that enables another to score.

Players get the reputation of being either self-centered or team players. Back in 2007, Philadelphia Phillies' manager Charlie Manuel rated the players on his team some of the most unselfish he had the privilege to work with. Over the years he worked with many focused on their own statistics, instead of working together as a team, making the opportunity to work with that particular Phillies team an uplifting and positive experience for him.

The church is the body of Christ. Interestingly, the apostle Paul likens it to the physical body with its many parts. These parts are interdependent. Some, he notes, are less noticeable than others, but nevertheless vital. All are needed for the body to function properly.

Now the body is not made up of one part but of many...If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has arranged the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be...there should be no division in the body, but...its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. (Selected verses from 1 Corinthians 12)

This describes the church as it should be: folks supporting one another, rejoicing with one another, sharing one another's hurts. Church team players are willing to do their share, serving where needed, giving sacrificially, representing the Lord and the church in a positive way to the watching world, using the gifts God has given them for the good of all.

Soon the Nominations Committee will be asking persons to serve in needed positions, and the Stewardship Team will be launching the annual campaign for commitments to the General Fund, which supports the mission and ministry of the church. Will you do your part to ensure that QUMC is a healthy body with all parts functioning?



CONFIRMATION 2022

Are you interested in the 2022 Confirmation Class? Do you have basic questions about what confirmation is and our process? Below are a few questions and answers. If you are interested in Confirmation for 2022, please contact Pastor Kathryn (kathrynswan19@gmail.com or 610.348.2632).

What does "confirmation" mean?

United Methodists use the term "confirmation" to mark the first time a baptized Christian publicly "confirms" their intention to live the vows of the baptismal and membership covenant and so becomes a professing member of the local congregation and The United Methodist Church.

Can I be confirmed more than once?

We expect that there may be several occasions during one's Christian life when one may wish to re-affirm or re-profess their commitment to live the baptismal and membership covenant faithfully. Doing so more than once does not change or add to one's status as a professing member in the Church. So while we encourage people to re-affirm as they find need, we do not call any subsequent reaffirmations or re-professions "confirmation."

I thought "confirmation" referred to a series of classes over weeks or months. Was I wrong?

While the process of preparing to confirm or profess one's commitment to live out the baptismal and membership covenant may take considerable preparation, which may include classes, retreats, service projects, and other spiritual exercises, the term confirmation properly belongs to what we do in the ritual when we publicly confirm our commitment.

What is the minimum age for confirmation in The United Methodist Church?

Our Judicial Council has clarified for us that the determination of when someone is ready to say with integrity that they will live out the baptismal and membership vows is left solely to the appointed pastor. The appointed pastor has full discretion to decide whether someone is ready, regardless of their age. That said, the nature of the questions we ask and the vows we take requires some degree of agency-- ability to act on one's own behalf.

I wasn't confirmed when I was a teenager. Is it too late for me to be confirmed now that I am an adult?

No, it is not. Remember, confirmation as such is not a process, though preparing for it should involve some kind of process. Confirmation is simply the first time a baptized Christian makes their public commitment to live out the baptismal and membership covenant among us and so become a professing member with us. You may be confirmed at 16, 60, or 92!

I am coming to The United Methodist Church as a confirmed member of a church in another denomination. Do I need to be confirmed again?

No, you do not. While we do ask that all persons seeking to become professing members in The United Methodist Church publicly profess our baptismal and membership vows, we do not call that process "confirmation" for those who are coming to us as "confirmed" or "full" members of other Christian denominations. We, as do many of our ecumenical partners, call it "reception." We will also offer you a process to orient you to life in our version of the baptismal covenant and in the wider life of the congregation, the district, the conference, and the denomination.

- ✓ Pennsylvania State Police Request for Criminal Records Check.
- ✓ Federal Criminal History Record Information (CHRI)

Volunteer Clearances (If your clearances need renewal)

All volunteers working with children must meet Safe Sanctuary requirements which include: Child Abuse Clearance <u>https://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis/public/home</u> Criminal Background Check <u>https://epatch.state.pa.us/Home.jsp</u>

Both are currently free to obtain.

You also must get a fingerprint check done if you have not lived in the state of Pennsylvania for 10 years, or you can sign a waiver instead if you have lived in Pennsylvania for 10 or more years. Here is the link:

Continued Appeal Regarding Bequest Opportunities: Bequests from individuals are an important part of the funding of our church's missions. - 1. Unrestricted bequest: This is a gift for our general purposes, to be used at the discretion of our Trustees and Finance Committees. A gift like this without conditions attached is frequently the most useful, as it allows us to determine the wisest and most pressing need for the funds at the time of receipt.
- 2. Restricted bequest: This type of gift allows you to specify how the funds are to be used. Perhaps you have a special purpose or project in mind. If so, it's best to consult us when you make your will to be certain that your intent can be carried out.
