Little yellow leaves from the front yard tree dance across the porch and driveway. As their bright green color fades, it seems they fall almost as quickly as they change. I love summer affectionately and part of me longs to whisper to the tree "Hold on a little longer. Come on; you got this. Think green!" But graciously the tree listens to its Maker rather than my foolish whispers. In order to flourish in the new season, the tree must let go of its decayed leaves. Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. *Ephesians 4:31,32 (NIV)* 

To get rid of negativity in our lives, we must first identify it. How can we do this?

- ✓ By reading God's Word.
- $\checkmark$  By allowing His Spirit to show us the necessary heart changes we need.
- $\checkmark$  By being willing to shun practices such as bitterness and anger.
- $\checkmark$  By asking God to help us let go of the guilt from the past.

Oh how the Lord longs to empower and strengthen us for the new season ahead! If we're not sure of the issues detaining a kind and compassionate spirit, He will show us when we ask. And if guilt from the past is preventing this beautiful new season, we have His promises like this one to remember:

Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. *Isaiah 43:18,19 (NIV)* 

What are you holding on to that is preventing a freshness to the season ahead? Could it be that the decayed leaves are piling up and your heart needs to discard them for good? If so, why not reach out to the Lord in prayer? He longs to hear from you. Ask Him to shine light on any thoughts, circumstances, habits or other "decayed leaves" you might be clinging to. As you watch the leaves fall this season, our prayer is that you are reminded to let go of anything that would hinder a fresh relationship with God.

#### Chicken Barbecue: The final numbers are in!

On September 11, QUMC served a total of 384 people at the Chicken Barbecue. After expenses, Missions made a profit of \$4,016.67. We sent four donations of \$600 each to: Jerusalem House in Allentown, Red Bird Mission in Kentucky, and Eliberto & Molly Juarez and Emily Miller, all three missionaries. A balance of \$1,616.67 remains and will be disbursed to five additional local organizations. We will also use a portion of the remaining money for food prep for Quakertown's Code Blue Shelter.

Missions could not have done the Chicken Barbecue without the help of the congregation. We had a total of 46 families help out. Thank you one and all!

#### **Blanket Sunday**

At difficult times, a kind and loving response can make all the difference. That is why the Church World Service Blanket program was created - to provide a tangible response to someone facing trying times, a reminder they are not alone.

Welcome back everyone! Due to COVID, we lost over a year, as well as track of Safe Sanctuary clearances and expiration dates. If your clearances are updated, please make sure we have a copy for our files. Contact Marj Lofland (215.257.7389, 267.227.8990, or yeamarj@gmail.com) for more information.

The following three background checks are required:

- ✓ Department of Human Services Child Abuse History Clearance.
- ✓ Pennsylvania State Police Request for Criminal Records Check.
- ✓ Federal Criminal History Record Information (CHRI)

If your original form has been misplaced, or if you need a new application, you can access the following links.

Volunteer Clearances (If your clearances need renewal)

All volunteers working with children must meet Safe Sanctuary requirements which include:

Child Abuse Clearance https://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis/public/home

Criminal Background Check <u>https://epatch.state.pa.us/Home.jsp</u>

Both are currently free to obtain.

You also must get a fingerprint check done if you have not lived in the state of Pennsylvania for 10 years, or you can sign a waiver instead if you have lived in Pennsylvania for 10 or more years. Here is the link:

**Continued Appeal Regarding Bequest Opportunities:** Bequests from individuals are an important part of the funding of our church's missions. If or when you plan a charitable bequest to help support the mission of the Quakertown United Methodist Church, you can direct your bequest it the following ways:

- 1. Unrestricted bequest: This is a gift for our general purposes, to be used at the discretion of our Trustees and Finance Committees. A gift like this without conditions attached is frequently the most useful, as it allows us to determine the wisest and most pressing need for the funds at the time of receipt.
- 2. Restricted bequest: This type of gift allows you to specify how the funds are to be used. Perhaps you have a special purpose or project in mind. If so, it's best to consult us when you make your will to be certain that your intent can be carried out.
- 3. Honorary or Memorial bequest: This is a gift given "in honor of" or "in memory of" someone. We are pleased to honor your request and have many ways to grant appropriate recognition.
- 4. Endowed bequest: This bequest allows you to restrict the principal of your gift, requiring us to hold the funds permanently and use only the investment income they generate. Creating an endowment in manner means that your gift can continue giving indefinitely.
